

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- $\P$  The European Commission and the Responsible Authority should clarify the system for measuring outputs, outcomes, and impacts. Accordingly, a complete data collection system should be designed, including a national program in order to improve the possibilities for assessing the fund's effectiveness and impact.
- $rac{Q}{F}$  Beneficiaries and the Responsible Authority should, with a view to enhancing management efficiency, review and strengthen preventive measures to mitigate the potential risk of information loss associated with staff turnover.
- $rac{Q}{\pi}$  During the project planning phase, beneficiaries should take into greater account the planned working time allocated for project management.
- $rac{Q}{\Psi}$  The European Commission should allow greater cross-use of equipment and software acquired under the fund. This is particularly important for a small country like Estonia, where equipment used solely for a single purpose (e.g., visa processing) tends to be underloaded.
